How to Move Around

Metro: a popular and relatively efficient mode of transportation. It consists of three lines, with Line 1 (from Helwan to El Marg) being the oldest and most commonly used by tourists. The metro is generally safe and a cost-effective way to navigate the city.

Bus: Cairo has an extensive bus network that covers various parts of the city. Schedules may not always be strictly adhered to. However, buses provide a budget-friendly option for those looking to explore different areas.

Microbuses and minibusses: widely used for transportation within Cairo, especially in areas not served by the metro or larger buses. They are a flexible but less regulated form of transport. While they can be a convenient option, travelers should be cautious about their belongings.Taxis are readily available throughout Cairo, and they offer a convenient and relatively inexpensive means of transportation. Ensure that the taxi driver uses the meter or agrees on a fare before starting the journey and use reputable taxi companies.Ridesharing services like Uber and Careem operate in Cairo, providing a convenient and good alternative to regular taxis. They offer reliable options with upfront pricing.
